Facts on the Martin County Veterans Memorial
The MCVM sign is done in red granite, symbolizing the blood shed for our country.
The black granite wall is done in an inverted V symbolizing valor.
The AH1 Cobra Helicopter is a 1966 F model and flew with the 7 of the 17th, C Troop in Vietnam. It flew out of Lane Helicopter Base. It was shot down in 1971 at the Battle of Lahm Son in Laos.

Recovered, it was return to the United States where it was refurnished and a G model engine was installed. It was used by the U.S. Forrest Service in Kern County, California, until it was acquired by MCVM, to fight forest fires..
While you visit our Memorial, you will see construction continuing all summer. A retaining wall behind the memorial wall. a ships bow, six statues, five granite benches and 300 foot of sidewalk will be installed.
The east side of our memorial contains the names of our counties KIA's, MIA's, and POW's. The KIA's are in chronological order of when they were killed.
